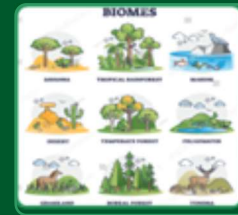
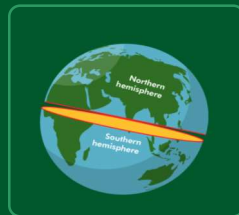




Key knowledge

- Know the names of 10 countries in both the northern and southern hemispheres.
- Know the names and locations of three major deserts from three different continents.
- Know what the prime meridian is and what it is used for.
- Know what the equator is.
- Know the location of the tropics of Cancer and Capricorn.
- Know the name of the longest river in Africa and Europe.
- Know the difference between the populations of different cities in Asia and which country has the highest.
- Know the difference between the populations of different cities in South America and which country has the highest.
- Know biome areas of the world including arctic, tundra, coniferous / deciduous forest, deserts, woodland and rainforest.



Key vocabulary

Latitude	Imaginary lines that run east to west around the world.
Longitude	Imaginary lines that runs north to south around the world.
Time zone (meridians)	Meridians that separate the Earth into 24-hour time zones.
Prime Meridian	An imaginary line that runs north to south around the world.
Equator	An imaginary line that runs east to west around the world.
Northern Hemisphere	Above the equator line.
Southern Hemisphere	Below the equator line.
Tropic of Cancer	An imaginary line located 23.5 degrees north of the equator.
Tropic of Capricorn	An imaginary line located 23.5 degrees south of the equator.
Biome	An area that is sorted according to habitat, soil and weather features.
Population	An amount of people who live in one location.

Fair trade	Trade where the sellers are not exploited and given a fair price for their goods / products / produce.

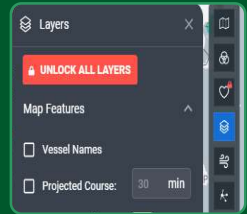
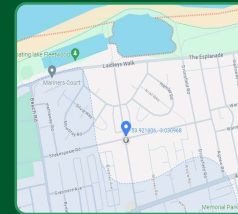
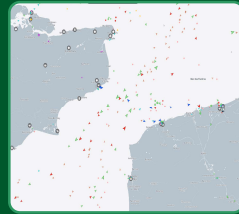
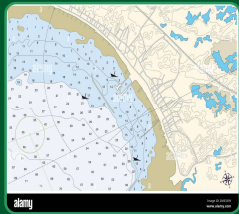

Key vocabulary

Maritime map	A graphic representation of a sea region or water body and adjacent coasts or banks. Also called nautical charts.
Transportation	The movement of goods and persons from place to place and the various means by which such movement is accomplished.
Shipping	The transporting of goods and passengers by water
Vessel Tracker	Website / digital service used to track the position of ships throughout the world. E.g www.marinetraffic.com
Measurement Tool	Used to measure distance on a digital map.
Pin	Used to mark a location on a digital map.
Layers	Layers can be switched on or off on a digital map to change the information shown.
