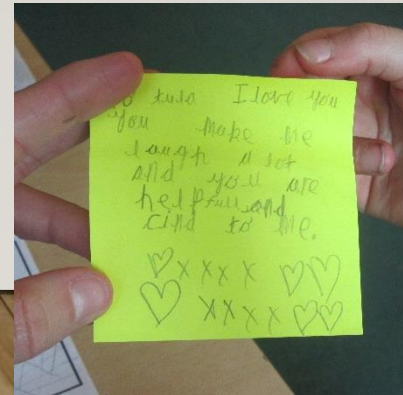
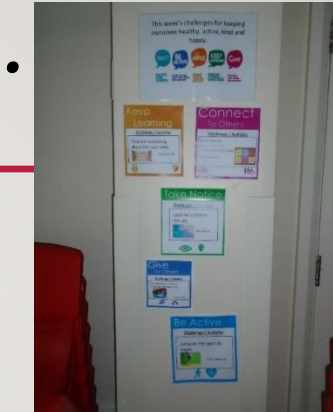
Children In Need

Fleetwood Well-being Way.

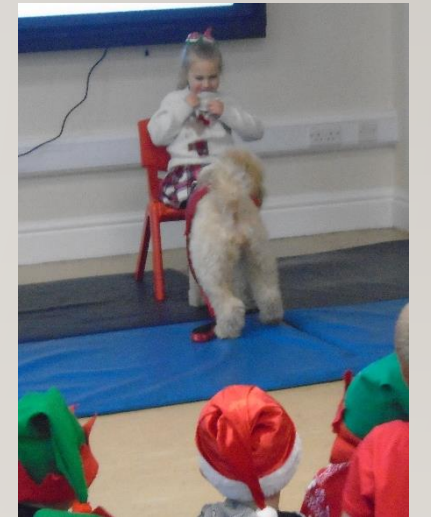
